## Message from the President

---

Since its inception in 1996, as the first Institute based Rotaract Club in Rotaract District 3220 - Sri Lanka & Maldives, the Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa has touched many lives igniting the passion to make a difference in the community. When I took the office as the 19th President of the Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa, the club was one of the prominent, strongest and most vibrant club in the district. There wasn't much for me to do but to continue the great adventures embarked on by my predecessors. They have built the foundation of this club with pure commitment and dedication, creating a platform for new leaders to be born exemplifying service above self.

We began our journey as "Fighting Dreamers", with the vision to "Make Dreams Real" for the Rotaract Year 2014/15. The year kicked-off with the project "Resonance", to reminisce the past and to redefine the future with new ideas and concepts. Resonance aimed to be the game changer for the new office bearers, helping them understand their roles and responsibilities as they take-on a challenging role in this organization.

In order to further strengthen the foundation of the club, we expanded our membership from 150 to 200 by inducting 50 active members from Faculty of Architecture and Faculty of Information & Technology. We focused on quality rather than quantity in our membership, thus we planned to have a continuous momentum throughout the year, through organizing projects in different scales and sizes. By creating the platform for the members to develop themselves and to provide them the opportunity to serve the community, we believed that we could not only sustain a strong membership but also attract new blood to the family of Rotaract.

This year we introduced a new methodology to plan and execute projects in such away that we will be utilizing our strength to the fullest. Creating teams to self-empower, self-organize and self-manage was one of the key considerations this year. Through self-governed small teams we were able to simultaneously organize multiple projects at a large scale. Another key component in our strategy was to have a perfected PR plan in each and every project, thereby increasing the impact by promoting the work in an efficient and effective manner. The strategy was carried out

under three stages for each project: pre campaign, ongoing campaign and post campaign. The success of this year is mostly influenced by the PR work as the latter part of this report elaborate.

The strength of the club is the active and vibrant membership while the steering wheel is the board of directors. We identified the importance of educating and empowering the directors to make better decisions, to inculcate good leadership skills and most importantly to perceive the vision of the club. Hence projects such as "Resonance" and "Retrospect" were organized to explore the boundaries and to share the experience, in order to collaboratively reach our goals by individually achieving their targets. Review meetings were organized with the avenue directors and the top board, to have in-depth discussions where we brainstormed on ideas and exclusively analysed the performance of past projects. This way we improved the decision making process by providing useful insights and tactical strategies to overcome any obstacles faced by the committee.

In addition to the novel concepts to empower our members, we ensured that the club enjoyed world class projects in all avenues. Starting from the most enjoyed club service project "Refraction" where the members competed in a treasure hunt, we were able to organize a camp fire, an e-sports tournament, an Awurudu festival and many more events that brought the family together for fellowship and entertainment. This year we went kept one step ahead and participated in almost all the club events organized by the district and other Rotaract Clubs. Our relationship with the Rotaract district and Rotary district were strengthened by actively engaging in their projects and involving them in our own. Some of the notable occasions worth mentioning are; becoming the Runners Up at the Rotaract Champions League and winning the Rotaract Plate Championship at the Hat-trick tournament. Participation in Rotary events such as the Rotary Leadership Seminar, Rotary District Conference and Rotary West project "Dream Cricket" helped us to expand our reach within the Rotary community.

Our club had many opportunities to network with the leaders in the corporate world and to strengthen the ties with them. Projects such as "Apprentice", "Inspico" and "Investomart" were few of the key projects that provided the platform for our members to connect, learn and get

inspired by the best. "Are You Ready" our signature project, continued to grow and deliver, catering 770 undergraduates and 56 companies this year.

In addition to the notable undertakings, the club went beyond boundaries to serve the community in need. The impact of the community service projects done this year is remarkable as we successfully completed projects at different locations addressing different aspects. Being the leading club to focus on the green concept once again, "Green Dream" continued to increase awareness and bring out practical approaches to build a greener environment. We carried out several projects inside the University to raise awareness within the local community about the process of recycling and waste management, and the use of biogas production. Further we conducted a reforestation project at Hanthana hills. With the aim to help the National Cancer Hospital to renovate the infrastructure which can provide a better facility to the patients, and to donate critical medical supplies which was a dire need at the moment, we brought back the concept of "Hand in Hand". As a novel concept this year we initiated "Healing Hands", conducting a health camp at Dankotuwa to provide free medical consultation to the underprivileged, and an awareness campaign on developing diseases such as Dengue and Diabetes.

While enjoying the fellowship, developing the skills of members and serving the community we also undertook projects to harness the international relationship with our Rotaract Community. We kicked off with an entertaining project "Halloween" which was a much enjoyed event of the year. Connecting the Rotaract souls around the world we initiated "My Rotaract Story" along side with the World Rotaract Week to demonstrate the power of Rotaract around the World. We also strengthened the close relationship with the Rotaract Club of Bombay Film City in most of our International Projects.

Many Rotarians deserve our thanks for their help in continuing to support our activities and providing us opportunities to grow stronger. I would like to extend my sincere gratitude to the President of the Rotary Club of Colombo West, Rtn. S. Sirikananthan and his entire board of directors; especially Youth Service Chair, Rtn. Roshan Perera and our District Governor Rtn. Gowri Rajan for their amazing support rendered throughout the year. It would be remiss if I did

not mention the support from the University administration. Special gratitude goes out to our Vice Chancellor Prof. Ananda Jayawardana, Deputy Vice Chancellor Prof. Rahula Attalage and Dean of Engineering Prof. Puswewala for the unconditional support in assisting and guiding us in our journey to make dreams real. Thank you all for your tremendous support!

I am excited to see the strength of our club, which can undertake any world-class project to serve the community and to bring out a positive change to the world. In 1995, Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa was founded as an institution based Rotaract Club sponsored by the Rotary Club of Colombo West. Today as well as throughout last 20 years club holds a reputed position among all the student organization within the university as the strongest vibrant student organization as well as one of the largest clubs in Rotaract District 3220. The club which started its journey with just 16 members has now grown into a dynamic organization with around 190 enthusiastic and dedicated members.

The avenue of Club Service become one of the most strengthened avenue of this year where we completed nearly 20 projects, specially the signature project 'CAST FOUR' an initiative taken to increase the attendance of the members to club meetings and projects. This Year CAST FOUR itself included five major sessions concerning many avenues. They are Campfire, E-sports, Soorya Rashmi, Fund raiser and community service project.

Continuing the legacy of 19 years, 'Are You Ready? 2014' the official careers fair of University of Moratuwa was successfully implemented creating a significant impact to the undergraduates who are stepping into the corporate world. The collaboration with over 60 companies in conducting over 1000 interviews for more than 800 students is a clear indication of the professionalism and level of detail that Rotaractors have organized this week long program. Apprentice, a new phenomenon initiated last year in the professional development avenue saw successful establishment of its concept within the university community as well the corporate sector where a series of professional mentoring and career coaching sessions were carried out for the undergraduates with the aim of equipping the undergraduates of the university with the necessary soft skills which will be advantageous in their future career paths. 'Inspico' supported Apprentice sessions as industrial orientation programme allowing the fresh undergraduates to experience the world of Engineering industry in relation to the respective fields of studying where the members were able to grab a vivid idea about the leaps and bounds, new horizons of the fields in which they are studying.

Illuminate, the English language skills enhancement program developed under the concept of inspirer along with Rotaract Club of University of Sri Jayawardanapura and 'First Leap' the math seminar series have been praised by the participating students from SOS village and Dudley

Senanayaka Vidyalaya, Narahenpita whilst there are many invitations already from SOS village to conduct sessions for other subjects to the students facing OL examinations.

Healing hands, the medical camp organized at Dankotuwa region is also one of the new initiative of the club in this year where the benefit was received by nearly 300 villagers. Incrementing the concept which won one of the Rotary International Citation, Hand in Hand is staged this year by renovating the kid play area of National Cancer Hospital, Maharagama with LKR245000 raised.

Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa produced a new phenomenon in International Service, with the bulletin of Rotaract experiences 'My Rotaract Story' where Rotaractors from India, Hong Kong and many other countries joined hands with Rotaract Mora to share their experiences as a Rotaractor to inspire the freshers to the Rotaract movement. Followed by the Orientation program conducted for the Level one batch of engineering faculty large number of undergraduates joins with the movement in first few months of the year. This year club was able to organize a special orientation program targeting undergraduates in IT faculty which in result increased the membership of the club than past years. Although there were many members joining the club they are only inducted after a probationary period where they are required to actively participate in projects carried out during the period in addition to being present to at least three consecutive General Meetings of the club.

The Induction Ceremony for Rotaract Year 2014/ 2015 was held on 8<sup>th</sup> of September 2014 at Civil Auditorium at the University premises to induct 72 members. 35 other members were inducted at a general meeting held on 19<sup>th</sup> January, 2015 by Dr.Ranga Rodrigo, senior treasurer and the staff adviser of the club.

Terminations are carried out annually where inactive members and members who leave the university after graduation is removed from the Club Register.

### Standard of the Active Membership

During each period the non-active members are removed from the Club Register hence the club maintains a membership of 175-200 members each year.

Membership details were sent to the District Officials of District 3220; District Director – Membership Development, Rtr. Riffath Hussain, District Secretary – Rtr. Ruwini Kodippili in the required format on 22<sup>nd</sup> December, 2014 and 8<sup>th</sup> February, 2015.

## Increase in Membership

The Orientation Program for the year 2015 was held for the newly joined students of Level – 1 batch in all three faculties of the university on 8<sup>th</sup> December 2015. The induction of prospective members is to be held in the beginning of Rotaract Year 2015/16.

The club membership has increased from 149 to 191 from June 2014 to May 2015 which is a total of 27% increment with respect to the total membership at the beginning of the year which well surpasses the 10% criteria set for clubs with a membership over 20.

## Public Relationship

At the beginning of the year, the club members decided to give more attention to the Public Relation aspects. Hence apart from the traditional ways of communication the club went on an extra mile to strength the public relations. For example we have installed a PR team and assigned tasks to all the team members to carry out throughout the year. In addition to that a new PR plan was developed to improve intercommunication between directors, project chairs & PR team.

# Club Service

## Message from the Committee

Being one of the largest clubs in the district, with a 180+ membership, it is not an easy task to deliver equal opportunities to all the members. Thus retaining the membership is somewhat difficult as the membership is increased in numbers.

For the year 2014/2015, our main focus was to adapt a model which ensures that all the Rotaractors get equal opportunities to develop themselves. To serve this purpose, we selected CAST4 as our flagship project of the avenue. This CAST4 model was first implemented in the year 2012/2013 and it was a proven to be successful at that time. Basic idea of this model is to divide the entire membership into four groups and establish a competition among the groups through continuous challenges.

For the year 2014/2015, we carefully planned these challenging activities to evaluate the organizing skills, communication skills, leadership skills, teamwork and other talents of the club members. 


