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Message from President

Since its inception in 1995, as the first Institute based Rotaract Club in Rotaract District 3220 -Sri Lanka & Maldives, the Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa has touched many lives, igniting the passion to make a difference in the community. When I took the office as the 21st President of the Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa, the club was recognized as one of the prominent, strongest and most vibrant clubs in the district. There wasn't much for me to do but to continue the great adventures embarked on by my predecessors. They have built the foundation of this club with pure commitment and dedication, creating a platform for new leaders to be born exemplifying service above self.

We continue our journey by turning a new chapter as a glimmer of light to aid children under the theme "Let them shine" for the Rotaract Year 2016/17 in line with "Vision to Action", the Rotaract District 3220 year theme for 2016/17. To further strengthen the foundation of the club, we expanded our membership from 123 to 226 by the end of Rotaract year 2015/2016. Focus was on quality rather than quantity in our membership, thus we planned to have a continuous momentum throughout the year, through organizing projects in different scales and sizes. By creating the platform for the members to develop themselves and to provide them with the opportunity to serve the community, we believed that we could not only sustain a strong membership but also attract new blood to the family of Rotaract.

We, Rotaract Mora, believe that projects planned with a long-term vision and specifications on how they should be executed and problems should be addressed, sustainably last for many years. With that vision, we concentrated our resources on planning sustainable initiatives for them to support in the coming years. The strategic plan was introduced to the club in the previous year (2015/16) and I am more than happy to mention that we could accomplish almost every aspect of the strategic plan for this year. 'Grama Prabodhaya', 'LinkR' and 'Zooxanthellae' are the signature projects which was initiated in this year per



the strategic plan.

'Grama Prabodhaya' - A sustainable community service initiative to develop rural villages in Sri Lanka as self-sufficient economic units. Abiding with the United Nations' Goal 10 of sustainable development goals - "Reduce inequality within and among countries", Rotaract Mora developed a three-year plan to address many issues that are within our capabilities and to enhance infrastructure, health, sanitation, education and sports facilities of the Ranugalla village - Monaragala. Surpassing all projects carried out by over 8000 worldwide Rotaract clubs in 167 countries, 'Grama Prabodhaya' was adjudged as the 'Single Club International Winner in year 2016-17 Rotaract Outstanding Project Award' by Rotary International'. This prestigious award was won for the first time by a Sri Lankan Rotaract club. As Rotaractors upholding the motto, 'Service Above Self', we humbly acknowledge this award as an appreciation of our commitment.

'LinkR' – A web based social networking community where Rotaractors can get together and build up a network like never before. The Global Rotaract Social Network web application was designed and impleRotaract

mented throughout the year in colabaration with the RI district 3220. The official launching ceremony of 'LinkR' was held on 13th May 2017 with the presence of District Governor Rtn. Senaka Amerasinghe while marking a milestone in the history of Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa.

'Zooxanthellae' - A sustainable environment initiative to designing, manufacturing and depositing steel structures in the sea bed in order to provide a base for the coral growth with the intentions of ensuring coast line protection, increasing fish stocks, strengthening the marine biodiversity and thereby preserving the Marine ecosystem for the future. During this year, we could conduct several surveys and finalize the deposit location near Rumassala Jungle Beach. With the support of the Siam Cement company we could finish building the metal structures as well. Those structures are planned to be installed in the ocean during the month of August 2017.

'Maestro' – An entrepreneurship empowerment platform was well planned and documented in the year along with the industry personnel being made aware. This project is to be initiated in the year of 2017/2018.

The official blog of the Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa has been revived with a new look, new thought and a new hope this year. Throughout the year more than 60 articles were published through the blog featuring different kinds of projects and general thoughts of members of the club. 'Write Out Loud' is a project in line with the blog to encourage Rotaractors to share their thoughts on various topics of interests in either Sinhala or English medium. The competition was open for all the Rotaractors worldwide.

Apart from the signature projects creating teams to self-empower, self-organize and self-manage was one of the key considerations for this year. Through self-governed small teams, we were able to simultaneously organize multiple projects at a large scale. Each and every member had a considerable contribution in decision making, project execution and planing. Another key component in our strategy was to have a perfected PR plan running parallel to projects, thereby increasing the impact by promoting the work in an efficient and effective manner. Strategy was implemented in a tailor-made manner which catered each project in a unique way.

The strength of the club is the active and vibrant membership while the steering wheel is the board of directors. We identified the importance of educating and empowering the directors to make better decisions, to inculcate good leadership skills and most importantly to perceive the vision of the club. Review meetings were organized with the avenue directors and the top board, to have in-depth discussions where we brainstormed on ideas and exclusively analyzed the performance of past projects. This way we improved the decision-making process by providing useful insights and tactical strategies to overcome any obstacles faced by the committee.

In addition to the novel concepts to empower our members, we ensured that the club members enjoyed projects in all avenues. Starting from the most enjoyed club service project "Refraction" where the members competed in a treasure hunt, we were able to organize a camp fire, an e-sports tournament and many more events that brought the family together for fellowship and entertainment. This year we went one step ahead and participated in almost all the club events organized by the District and the other Rotaract Clubs. Our relationship with the Rotaract District and Rotary District were strengthened by actively engaging in their projects and involving them in our own. Rotary Club of Colombo West's renowned project "International Dream Cricket" helped us to expand our reach within the Rotary community. Further, we participated in two general meetings of the Rotary Club of Colombo West and at the meetings we were recognized for winning the RI award for the most outstanding Rotaract project.

Our club had many opportunities to network with the leaders in the corporate world and to strengthen the ties with them. Projects such as "Apprentice" and "Inscribe" were few of the key projects that provided the platform for our members to connect, learn and get inspired by the best. "Are You Ready?" our signature project, continued to grow and deliver, catering 1200 undergraduates and more than 60 companies this year.

In addition to the notable undertakings, the club went beyond boundaries to serve the community in need. The impact of the community service projects



done this year is remarkable as we successfully completed projects at different locations addressing different aspects. Being a leading club to focus on the green concept, we continued to increase awareness and bring out practical approaches to build a greener environment. Further we conducted a reforestation project at Hanthana hills named "Green Legacy" in collaboration with the Rotaract clubs of University of Peradeniya and Kelaniya.

With the aim to help the National Cancer Hospital to renovate the infrastructure which can provide a better facility to the patients and to donate critical medical supplies which was a dire need at the moment, we continued the concept of "Hand in Hand" which was brought back in the previous year. As an addition, we conducted a workshop for parents of the patients named as "Hope" with the aim of motivating them. A massive fundraiser was done by selling Christmas and Vesak cards to the public and the total amount raised for the project was RS. 983 698.17. This is the maximum amount of money which has been raised in the history of Rotaract Mora.

While enjoying the fellowship, developing the skills of members and serving the community we also undertook projects to harness the international relationship with our Rotaract Community. We kicked off with an entertaining project "Halloween Night" which was a much enjoyed event of the year. We also strengthened the close relationship with the Rotaract Club of Bombay Film City by signing the twin club agreement. Project "Sojourn" was focused on conducting a series of sessions including a visit to India and an amazing site seeing for the club members in Mumbai. This was the very first time in Rotaract Mora history that a group of members visited a foreign country for an International Service project.

Many Rotarians deserve our thanks for their help in continuing to support our activities and providing us opportunities to grow stronger. I would like to extend my sincere gratitude to the President of the Rotary Club of Colombo West, Rtn. Roshan Perera and his entire board of directors; especially our beloved Youth Service Chair, Rtn. Yukthi Gunasekara and our District Governor Rtn. Senaka Amarasinghe for their amazing support rendered throughout the year. Gratitude also goes out to our Vice Chancellor Prof. Ananda Jayawardana, Deputy Vice Chancellor Prof. Rahula Attalage and Dean of Engineering Prof. K.K.C.K Perera for the unconditional support in assisting and guiding us in our journey to rekindle hope. It would be remiss if I did not mention the tremendous support from our very own senior treasurer and staff advisor Dr. Ranga Rodrigo. His support in all the endeavours drove the club to greater heights. I would like to further extend my gratitude for the District Rotaract Representative Rtr. PP. Mohamed Husni and his team for the continuous guidance throughout the year. Thank you all for your support!

I am excited to see the strength of our club, which can undertake any world-class project to serve the community and to bring out a positive change to the world. I am positive that this club can and will witness many more outstanding projects in the future and shine as one of the most vibrant Rotaract Clubs in the region. Initiated in 1995, with 16 members as the first ever university based Rotaract Club in Sri Lanka, Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa has continued to serve humanity through numerous sustainable and impactful projects over 20 glorious years. Currently, comprising of a membership over 200 Rotaractors, Rotaract Mora has established herself as one of the most-strongest and vibrant student organizations within the university providing a platform for so many young men and women to make a positive change to the world through 'Service above Self'.

The commitment and untiring efforts of our predecessors have made Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa, one of the most outstanding Rotaract clubs in District 3220 and thus, in July 2016, President Rtr.Chamal Kuruppu and his board of Directors took the office with the aspiration of continuing the legacy for another year under the theme 'Let Them Shine'. The year kicked off with the '21st Installation Ceremony' followed by the 'Induction Ceremony' where commitment of the Rotaractors were highly appreciated in addition to the main objectives of the projects.

The avenue of Club Service acts as the major pillar of attracting the new members to the club as well as retaining the club membership. 'Collaborative Avenue Service Team Four' precisely known as CAST4 project series organized by the club service avenue, brings the membership of Rotaract Mora together every year to compete, to grow and to have fun. This year's CAST4 Theme, 'Harry Potter' was revealed in an astonishing way at the 'CAST4 Theme Reveal' with the formation of four CAST4 teams providing promising signs for the Rotaractors that their events are going to be filled with fun and excitement.

The events, 'IQ Master', 'Refraction', 'E-Sports', 'Camp Fire' and 'Inscribe' were organized as sub projects of CAST4 enabling the Rotaractors to strengthen their bonds as well as display their skills in numerous aspects. The projects 'Orientation 2016' and 'Club Get Together' organized by the avenue of club service further catered the above requirements as well as



providing the newbies of the club the opportunity to get to know insights of Rotaract Mora.

'Are You Ready?', the official careers week of the university organized by the Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa in collaboration with the Career Guidance Unit of the University marks a much-awaited event in the university calendar. 'Are You Ready? 2016' was completed as the most successful careers fair organized by the university so far, with a wider reach of companies and university undergraduates.

In addition to the signature project 'Are You Ready?' the avenue of Professional Development organized project series 'Apprentice' and 'Inspico' with the intention of bridging the gap between the university curriculum and the industry and providing the opportunity for the university undergraduates to acquire necessary soft skills. Further the projects 'Write Out Loud' and 'Inscribe' were organized in collaboration with the avenue of club service, in order to bring out and sharpen the talents of our Rotaractors.

'Grama Prabodhaya' which is a sustainable community service initiative organized by Rotaract Mora became a highlight of the Rotaract year with the reception of 'Rotary International Recognition as the Most



Outstanding Rotaract project of the year'. The project focusses on developing rural villages of Sri Lanka as self-sufficient economic units and a three-year plan was developed and implemented targeting revival of 'Ranugalla' village in Monaragala District. Having completed a series of sub projects, the initial phase of the project was concluded in April 2017 after donating a fully equipped science laboratory and a library for the village school.

'Hand in Hand' the annual fund raising event of the club is organized with the intention of lending a helping hand to the small children suffering from cancer at the 'Apeksha Hospital' (National Cancer Hospital), Maharagama. Seeing the success of the previous years' projects, this year's Hand in Hand was organized as two phases targeting the 'Christmas' and 'Vesak' seasons. Sub projects 'Hope' and 'Colours' were organized giving these children the warmth of love and happiness.

Renewing the relationship with our twin club, Rotaract Club of Bombay Film City, the twin agreement was signed for one more year at the 'Sojourn phase 2' where six of our Rotaractors visited India. Extending our service beyond boundaries, a series of sub projects were organized in India in collaboration with RCBOFC. 'One Global Force' the e-forum hosted by the avenue of International Service was active during the year and a major discussion was carried out on eradication of women abuse and many other foreign Rotaract clubs joined the forum. As an outcome of the project, a sticker campaign was carried out on raising public awareness on the subject.

Apart from that, the avenue of International Service put forward a revolutionary effort in connecting Rotaractors worldwide, through introducing LinkR, a webbased social networking platform focused on achieving the objectives such that improving the interactions between the Rotaractors worldwide and providing them opportunities to participate and volunteer in the projects organized by local and global Rotaract Clubs. We believe that LinkR would facilitate massive changes in the Rotaract fraternity in the near future.

The blog of Rotaract Mora was relaunched at the beginning of the Rotaract year and the new features catered in delivering the voice of Rotaract Mora to the entire world with constant updates. While initiating more than 50 projects throughout the year, Rotaract Mora was able to build up strong relationships with the fellow Rotaract clubs of District 3220 and participate in majority of their projects, which we would consider as a significant step kept forward.

Reaching towards the end of another Rotaract year, as the Secretary of the Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa, I would like to proudly say that we have completed a remarkable year with the involvement of majority of club membership, strengthening the network with our fellow Rotaract clubs and most importantly initiating sustainable projects which truly made and would make a much-needed set of individuals across the globe, shine.

INTRODUCTION TO THE CLUB & HISTORY

Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa is the first university based Rotaract Club of Sri Lanka. Initiated in 1995 with 16 members, the club has now grown to a membership of over 200 members representing all the faculties of the University, namely Faculties of Engineering, IT and Architecture. Apart from Community Service over the years, the club has widened its horizons into other areas like Professional Development, Club Services, International Services and Environmental Development. chartered under Rotaract District 3220, the club is sponsored by the Rotary Club of Colombo West.

For Rotaract year 2016/2017 the club is led by President Rtr. Chamal Kuruppu along with his board of directors under the theme 'Let Them Shine'. The Rotaract Club is one of the most active clubs within the university and also the renowned organizer of 'Are You Ready?', the official careers fair of the University of Moratuwa. Upholding the motto of Rotaract, "Service Above Self", the Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa continues to initiate dozens of projects each year, serving as the ideal platform for the men and women who believe they can make a difference to gather around.

The club has won the award, "Rotaract Outstanding Project – South Asia Region" twice for the projects "You Are Not Alone" and "HandZ" in 2000 and 2011 respectively, from the Rotary International. Apart from the international accolades the club has continued to win awards and citations at the annual Rotaract District Assemblies. The Rotaract year 2016/17 became yet another remarkable year for Rotaract Mora by receiving the recognition as the 'Single Club International Winner in year 2016/17 Rotaract Outstanding Project Awards, organized by Rotary International' for the project 'Grama Prabodhaya'.

CLUB HISTORY

• Inception of the club

The Rotaract club of University of Moratuwa was formed with 16 members in the year 1995 under the guidance of Past President Rtr. Thushan Wijesinghe of Rotaract Club of Colombo West who was also an undergraduate of University of Moratuwa. This was the first university based Rotaract club in Sri Lanka.

• Presentations

This was the first project carried out by the club. This project was about acclimatizing the undergraduates to shoulder the responsibilities in the corporate world.

• Charter Presentation ceremony

Charter of the club was handed by the District Governor Rtn. Ranjith Samarasinghe to charter President Rtr. Nishan Weerasooriya, with the presence of Vice Chancellor Prof G.T.F. De Silva and President of Rotary Club of Colombo West Rtn. Asoka Jayasinghe.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS 2016/17

The office bearers of the Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa for the Rotaract year 2016/2017 were elected prior to 1st April 2016 and the President Rtr.Chamal Kuruppu and his Board of Directors were inducted at the 21st Installation ceremony of Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa held on 30th July 2016 at DHPL Auditorium, Colombo. The Director Board 2016/2017 of Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa comprised of 32 Board Members stated as follows.







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REPORTING

Minutes were recorded during each General Meeting and Board Meeting and filed on a regular basis. Minutes of the previous meeting were circulated among the club members via emails prior to each meeting. Monthly Reports (from July 2016 to May 2017) were duly completed and submitted by the stipulated deadline to the District Secretary of Rotaract District 3220. Detailed project reports of all the projects were duly prepared and submitted after the completion of the project. Monthly reports and project reports were also emailed to the Youth Service Director of Rotary Club of Colombo West Rtn. Yukthi Gunasekara who gave prompt response regarding all reports completed during the year.

MEETINGS

DATE AND TIME

General Meetings of a particular month were held during the first week and the third week while the board meetings were held during the first week and when a need arose. The regular meeting schedule was revised during the examination periods and due to special occasions within the university.

VENUE

All the General Meetings were held within the university premises except the Joint General Meeting held with the Rotaract Club of Colombo West. Usually halls like ENTC 1, New TLM Auditorium and NCSLB Ground Floor were used and some of the special general meetings were held at the 'Civil Auditorium' to cater to a greater number of members and prospective members. Board Meetings were held within the university premises as well as outside the university, as convenient to the director board. Since most of the meetings were carried out within the university, members were not required to make any payments regarding accommodation for meetings.

AGENDA AND NOTICES

Two to three days prior to every General meeting a flyer was posted in all the facebook groups created for each intake group of the university, announcing the date, time and venue of the meeting. The day prior to the meeting, the agenda and other details were posted by the Secretary on the facebook groups. Additionally, members were informed about the meeting via the 'Rotaract Mora' official email group. President Rtr. Chamal informed about the board meetings through social media as well as via emails. The date and venue of the board meetings were finalized only after discussing with the members via whatsapp group of the director board and considering their convenience to attend.





PARTICIPATION

Minutes of the General Meetings and Board Meetings were taken down at the meeting and circulated among the club members and board members respectively subsequent to the meeting via the official email groups. Then the minutes were presented at the beginning of the following meeting where they were amended or proposed as accurate. The amended meeting minutes were emailed to the Youth Service Director of Rotary Club of Colombo West copying to club President Rtr. Chamal Kuruppu.

EXCUSES

Excuses were tabled for absentees at the beginning of each General Meeting. Members sent their excuses prior to the meeting via email explaining the reasons. Some of the members who were engaged in Industrial Training were excused from meetings during their training period.

FEATURES

Some special sessions were organized in parallel with the General Meetings in order to enhance the effective participation and to make the club members more active and enthusiastic.

CAST4 SESSIONS :

CAST4 sessions were conducted with the support of the club service team during General Meetings with the aim of attracting more members and enhancing their participation at meetings. These sessions also catered in strengthening the bond among club members while enabling them to have a fun filled evening, gaining more points to their respective CAST4 teams.

ICE-BREAKING SESSIONS :

At every General Meeting, club welcomes at least 5 new members as a result of its growing impression and image built within the university. Thus, prior to the General Meeting proceedings an ice braking session was carried out to get familiarized with each other and new members were introduced to gathering.

CELEBRATIONS & FELICITATIONS :

Appreciating the commitment and hard work of the organizing committees of successful signature projects such as 'Are You Ready? 2016', 'Grama Prabodhaya' and 'Hand in Hand' felicitation ceremonies were organized at the General meetings. Some special celebrations such as member birthday celebrations etc. too took place after meetings.

CLUB REGISTER

The club register was duly signed by present members as well as prospective members and guests. Present member count was totalled and recorded regularly. The responsibility of maintaining the register was assigned to the Club Secretary or the Assistant Secretary and Sgt. At Arms at the absence of Secretary.

STANDARD OF ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP

Terminations are carried out annually where inactive members and members who leave the university after graduation is removed from the club register. Hence the club maintains a membership of 170-230 members each year.

SUBMISSION OF MEMBERSHIP DETAILS

Membership details were sent to the District Officials of District 3220 in the required format following each induction and as and when required by the District. Membership Directory as at 31st May 2017 is attached in Annex.

INCREASE OF MEMBERSHIP

In addition to the main Orientation Program carried out by the club on 20th December 2016 targeting the new intake batch of the university, several other sub orientation programs were conducted for all the three faculties separately. As a result of these programs and the major club service projects carried out within the university, a large number of undergraduates joined with the movement during the Rotaract year 2016/17. Although there were many members joining the club they are only inducted after a probationary period where they are required to actively participate in projects carried out during the period in addition to being present to at least three consecutive General Meetings of the club. The Induction Ceremony for Rotaract Year 2016/ 2017 was held on 30th August 2016 at Civil Auditorium at the University premises to induct 60 prospective members. Long Term Sustainability Plan

Being part of a wide spread voluntary organization, Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa highly focuses on achieving sustainability through the projects organized by the club as well as the Rotaract club as whole. Rotaract Mora follows a strategy to continue the same set of projects each year while introducing new advancements to them as well as introducing new projects. Thus, Rotaractors of the club stay in touch with their juniors giving continuous inputs through the experience they received from the previous Rotaract year. This knowledge transferring process has become the major reason for the continuous success of the massive projects organized by Rotaract Mora. Focusing on contributing towards the sustainable development of the country, a sustainability plan was developed by the club during the Rotaract year 2015/16 comprising three long term sustainable projects of which two were implemented during the Rotaract year 2016/17.

GRAMA PRABODHAYA

'Grama Prabodhaya' which stands for revival of villages was initiated by the Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa with the broad vision of developing rural villages of Sri Lanka as self-sufficient economic units. In order to carry out the first step, 'Ranugalla' village in 'Monaragala' District, which is one of much needy and underprivileged districts of Sri Lanka was chosen and a three-year plan was developed focusing on the development of education, health, sports, infrastructure and economy of the village. During the first year of implementation, a series of sub projects were initiated to support the said areas and with 'Grama Prabodhaya' so far, we have been able to create a considerable impact on 'Ranugalla' Village and its community at large.

Through 'Grama Prabodhaya', we intend to introduce the world this novel concept of 'Rotaract Villages'. In Sri Lanka a 'Rotaract village' would be a village facilitated by Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa and funded by the CSR allocation of corporate organizations. The villagers will receive benefits of these CSR allocations from the companies acting as trustees/caretakers who will be responsible for a particular aspect. An online matching platform is being built to support the expansion and matching the requirements with the corporate organizations.

The mission of 'Grama Prabodhaya' is to develop villages in Sri Lanka as one self-sufficient economic unit. Rather than just contributing material donations to a needy village, 'Grama Prabodhaya' focuses on a variety of aspects of a village's development. The project focuses on a village's existing socio-economic structure and leads to an improved quality of life. Without stopping by just one year or one village, we are hoping to expand this to the entire country thereafter.





LINK-R

Rotaract movement has spread all over the world as one of the most prominent youth led voluntary organizations at present. This paves way for a dire need of a proper integrated system which could connect Rotaractors all over the world to discuss about their ongoing projects and to seek help from fellow Rotaractors to uplift the standards as well as the scope of such projects. We, Rotaract Mora, has identified this gap between Rotaractors all over the globe and developed a promising solution which could change the current practices of Rotaractors to a newer and a modern dimension. This web based application is known as 'LinkR' which was launched in May 2017. We firmly believe that, 'LinkR' would provide a platform for IS directors to share their IS projects to gain more publicity hence more support. We are working with a solid plan to uplift this platform into a more sophisticated system with the aim of engaging a large proportion of worldwide Rotaractors with this platform.

MAESTRO

Maestro is a novel project initiated by Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa in cooperation with a leading organization in the industry with the aim of building sound entrepreneurs. This will be conducted in the form of a competition and the participants will be given the opportunity to solve a challenge faced by the company. This will not only test and sharpen their analytical and problem solving skills but will also give them a platform to interact with industry experts and learn corporate ethics. The competition will be open for undergraduates of State and private universities, other educational institutes and members of Rotaract clubs in Sri Lanka, with the age limit of 18-26 years. Maestro is conducted with the intention of providing a unique platform for the Rotaractors and undergraduates to display their professional skills and to provide the industry an opportunity to identify upcoming talent. We believe that this initiative will be a breakthrough in the process of widening the scope for professional development of the youth.

ZOOXANTHELLAE

Uplifting our service as Rotaractors in to a newer dimension, the avenue of Environment of Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa, proposed 'Zooxanthellae', an artificial coral reef building project during the Rotaract year 2016/17 with the intentions of ensuring coast line protection, increasing fish stocks, strengthening the marine biodiversity and thereby preserving the Marine ecosystem for the future. Moving forward with the concept, Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa along with the support of Earth Resources 'Engineering' Department of University of Moratuwa, in collaboration with Siam City Cement (Lanka) Ltd, decided to take the initial step of supporting the growth of coral reefs by designing, manufacturing and depositing steel structures in the sea bed which will provide a base for the corals as well as create a secure environment for a vast variety of marine habitats. And this would be the first time ever in Sri Lanka that an artificial coral reef is being built using steel as a base structure. Considering the focus of Zooxanthellae in sustainable development of life under the ocean and ocean related environment, it was included in the sustainability plan of the club.



'Ganga Addara' is a project initiated by the Rotaract Club of Alumni of University of Moratuwa for the preservation of river banks by planting relevant trees when and where necessary under the supervision of the forestry department. The second phase of the project was carried out jointly by the Rotaract Clubs of Alumni of University of Moratuwa and University of Moratuwa at Udagama, Padukka with the participation of enthusiastic Rotaractors of both clubs. Trees with high capacity of preserving river banks and those act as barriers to soil erosion and other harmful situations were planted and through project 'Ganga Addara' we were able to enhance the knowledge and awareness on preserving river banks among fellowmen.



Zooxanthellae is the novel attempt in environmental preservation arena,

organized for the first time in the Rotaract history of Sri Lanka with the timely purpose of providing necessary provisions for the sustenance of coral reefs. It is not to be emphasized that the coral reefs have a great impact on the protection of coastline and marine lives. Yet, due to the rapid pursuit of development, we have forgotten to fulfi our share for the protection and sustenance of this priceless and rare natural resource.

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Therefore, as a responsible organization, Rotaract club of University of

Moratuwa along with the support of Professor Nalin Rathnayake of the Earth Resources Department of University of Moratuwa, in collaboration with Siam City Cement (Lanka) Ltd and Sri Lankan Navy decided to take the initial step of supporting the growth of coral reefs by designing, manufacturing and depositing steel structures in the sea bed which will provide a base for the corals as well as create a secure environment for a vast variety of marine habitats.

The first phase of Zooxanthellae consisted of 3 sub projects including two surveys and a beach cleaning project. The two extensive surveys were carried out in the coastline of Unawatuna and Rumassala with the support of Siam City Cement & Sri Lanka Navy. During the past months we have visited Coast Conservation Department (CCD), National Aquatic Resources Research and Development agency (NARA), Sri Lanka Navy and Ministry of Defence in order to obtain permission to carry out the project. The steel structures are currently being constructed at the Siam City Cement plant, Galle and will be ready to be deposited in a few months.

Researches state that the pollution that is done to the beach is directly affecting the ocean and its living creatures. Therefore, a clean beach is a crucial need to guarantee the safety of the ocean and its life. Thus 'Green Beach' was initiated as a phase of Zooxanthellae and it was decided to clean the Panadura beach which was subjected to a massive environmental pollution. Apart from beach cleaning the aim was also to educate the locals and the students about environmental pollution. Therefore, it was not only a beach cleaning program but also an awareness project. After carefully observing the site it was decided to establish 4 large garbage bins in the beach since there were no adequate garbage disposal facilities on the beach. Apart from the garbage bins, posters about environmental protection and awareness posters about the correct methods of disposing garbage were designed. The Panadura beach was divided into 3 sections where three groups cleaned the relevant areas. After the cleaning-session an awareness speech on beach pollution was given to the participants. It was a fruitful day where all the participants were actively involved in cleaning and the project ended. Funds for the project were raised by selling pens and a portion of the funds raised was donated to Rotary's one million trees project.

ZOOXANTHELLAE – SURVEYS

Survey Day 1

The first survey of Zooxanthellae took place on the 29th October 2016 at the Unawatuna Coastline marking the beginning of a long journey in the hope of conserving the most precious resources of the marine ecosystem. With the support of Prof. Nalin Rathnayake and Siam City Cement (Lanka) Ltd, a group of Rotaractors set off to Unawatuna early in the morning. All necessary equipment to carry out the survey was provided by the Earth Resources Engineering department. After a short discussion with the helmsman we decided to carry out the survey in 3 different locations. A few hours were spent in the sea adding many interesting memories beside the survey. All the required conditions including temperature, turbidity, seichi depth, nutrient percentages and GPS locations were tested in all 3 locations. Water samples and sediment samples were collected in order to check the nutrient percentages.

Survey Day 2

The 2nd survey of Zooxanthellae was held on the 20th May 2017 with the intention of finding the best location for the final deposition event. The survey was carried out in the coastline of Rumassala according the suggestion made by Rear Admiral Piyal De Silva (Director Operations, Sri Lanka Navy). A group of Rotaractors, along with Prof. Nalin Rathnayake headed to the Jungle Beach with all the equipment required to carry out the survey. With the aid of Siam City Cement and the technical support of Prof. Nalin we managed to gather all the required measurements. The result of the second survey proved that the prevailing condition at Rumassala coastal line was far better than Unawatuna. Finally we were able to confirm the place to deposit our structures. Having found the most suitable location for depositing structure the team members were thrilled and excited.





We believe that this initiative will be a breakthrough in the process of widening the scope for professional development of the youth.





Fund Raising

HAND IN HAND

'Hand in Hand' organized by the Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa, is a community service project aimed towards the well being of the child cancer patients with its focus centered on Apeksha Hospital,Maharagama. While catering the needs of the child victims, the community is made aware on the necessity of this worthy cause.

Initiated in 2008, "Hand in Hand" has brought the fading hopes back to the patients suffering from cancer since then. Identifying that the necessity still exists, Rotaractors of Rotaract Mora, paved the way for another "Hand in Hand" which consisted of two phases-Christmas and Vesak. The project that started in September 2016 was successfully completed on the 20th of June, 2017.

Funds were raised at each phase by selling greeting cards which were printed with the paintings done by child victims of cancer and T-shirts printed to encourage the community to support these little children. As another step forward a counselling session for the families of the little children was organized to uplift their mind states and make them strong enough to be a strength for their own children. The raised funds were used in developing and improving the children's ward of the hospital and providing the child victims with required medicines.

CHRISTMAS SALES

After the first painting session 'Colours 1', a total of 7500 cards were printed in two batches using the paintings done by the children at the Apeksha Hospital as the designs. Since fund raising was a major factor of the project, cards were distributed among the entire membership of Rotaract Mora. Sales were done mainly focusing on the tuition classes in the Western and North Western provinces. Within 2 months, our Rotaractors managed to raise funds over LKR 400000.

T SHIRT PROJECT

In addition to the seasonal greeting cards, Rotaractors came up with another product to gather more funds in order to help the cancer victims. The T-shirts were designed with the slogan "Don't Let Them Fight Alone" in the back and with the Helping Hand in the front and was printed in two colours; blue and white. The T-shirts could be reserved online that many from outside the university also bought it though the sales of T-shirts was planned to be done only inside the university. Rotaractors, sacrificing their lunch time engaged in selling T-shirts to make this sub project a success. As a result, LKR 110,400 was collected which would be dedicated to the betterment of the child victims of cancer at Apeksha Hospital, Maharagama.





VESAK SALES

A total of 8000 vesak cards were printed for the final phase, Vesak Phase using the paintings done by the children at the Apeksha Hospital at 'Colours 2'. Rotaractors as well as the undergraduates of University of Moratuwa enthusiastically engaged in selling cards within as well as outside the university. Fund raising programme was mainly done in Western and North Western provinces. Even the sales were done among assignments and examinations, the team succeeded in raising nearly an amount of LKR 435000.

The effort of the whole Rotaract family resulted in raising LKR 900,000 only from the sales of the cards and T-shirts. The message they took into the community brought back many generous donations increasing the total raised funds into LKR 990,000.

Home Alone is the cluster project organized by the cluster 5 of Rotaract District 3220 with the intention of building up the basic awareness of Rotaractors on things that are not needed in day to day life, but that may come handy in certain occasions. Rotaract clubs of cluster 5, i.e. Rotaract Clubs of University of Moratuwa, Edulink International Campus, Wellawatte, General Sir john Kotelawala Defence University, Manipay, Badulla and Kurunegala joined hands together in order to cater the desired benefits to the target group of the project. Thus the project was carried out as a series interactive workshops on following categories.

- Automobile
- Electricity
- Plumbing & Drainage
- Simple construction
- First Aid

The sessions were carried out by the industry professionals as well as the Rotaractors of the hosting clubs who are experts in the particular fields. From the interactive session conducted on simple construction, most of the participants got to know about how to inspect a land, how to check whether the walls of a building are in good state and many more. The session conducted on electricity gave the participants a hands on experience about the basic wiring of a switch, the wiring of a two way switch and parallel wiring along with a circuit model. During the automobile session, the participants were educated on how to remove a vehicle tire, how to perform a quick pre-start check on a vehicle and many other things that are useful to know, if we are using a vehicle in our day to day lives. Likewise, the event concluded in a productive way achieving all its objectives.

Vision to Action Projects

GRAMA PRABODHAYA

Transforming our world: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, also known as the Sustainable Development Goals, is a set of seventeen aspirational "Global goals" introduced by the United Nations. Goals 3, 4, and 6 corresponds Good Health and Well-being, Quality Education, and Clean Water and Sanitation respectively which many villages in developing and non-developed countries are lacking.

Sri Lanka is still a developing country in the Asian continent. There lies a number of rural areas all over the island which the villagers have the need and the intention to be developed. The most crucial areas to be ameliorated within these villages resembles the three main goals mentioned above. Many of them lack adequate schools and teachers, hospitals, clean water to drink, and appropriate lavatory facilities. Due to such causes, the country is losing healthy, educated people and hence, even the children lack their confidence to blend in with the society.



Following the theme "Vision to Action" of the Rotaract District 3220, the Rotaract Club of University had the vision to develop a village in multiple aspects and help them to sustain a better quality of life while making the village a self-sufficient economic unit. With that vision in mind, the Rotaractors of University of Moratuwa brainstormed to come up with a community service initiative that can sustain and improve over the years to come with the support of various communities and organizations combined with the strength of the club membership. The project was named as "Grama Prabodhaya".

The project was initiated together with the MillenniumIT Software (Pvt) Ltd, and is capable of fulfilling the UN Sustainable Development Goals #3, #4, and #6. A village in the Monaragala district, called "Ranugalla" was chosen for Grama Prabodhaya, and the project executed within several phases which include tailor made mini projects addressing the key prevailing issues in the village. Along with the Grama Prabodhaya project, we hope to cater the following aspects to help the people to sustain a better quality of life.

Enhance basic education and literacy by conducting a series of seminars on Mathematics, Science, English and Sinhala Language targeting the Ordinary Level Students.
Improve the infrastructure within the school premises by donating a building three rooms that suits for a science laboratory, a library and a classroom.
Improve the facilities needed for sports and the library by donating sports equipment and books for the library.
Enhance the mentality and motivation of students and villagers by hosting speeches by our own rotaractors.
Disease prevention in the village by organizing a health camp for all the villagers.
Providing access for clean water and enhancing sanitation in the village.

Grama Prabodhaya is introduced not only for developing the selected village, but also to let the rotaractors enhance the bond among each other and illuminate the image of Rotaract Mora. We believe the fact that the projects of this caliber will provide ample opportunities for the blossoming undergraduates to sharpen their soft skills making them competent graduates in the years to come.

Further, since this is not just another material donation community services project, we believe the collective effort to develop a rural village comprehensively in many aspects will uplift the quality of life of the villagers as well as the rotaractors who joined their hands with Grama Prabodhaya project.

ZOOXANTHELLAE

As a universal call to action in order to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure that all people enjoy peace and prosperity United Nations have introduced 17 Sustainable Development Goals. Goal 14 - 'Life under water' is dedicated to conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources.

Oceans cover three quarters of the Earth's surface. Even though coral reefs represent less than 0.1% of the world's ocean floor, they support more than 25% of all marine species. But current researches show that 20 percent of the world's coral reefs have been destroyed and shows no prospects for recovery. Also about 24% of the remaining reefs are under the risk of collapse through human pressures, and a further 26% are under a longer -term threat of collapse.

Therefore it is necessary that we should take immediate action in order to preserve these riches of the environment for our future generations. With a vision of increasing fish stocks, marine biodiversity and substituting reef destruction through artificial coral reefs we as Rotaractors of University of Moratuwa initiated the project Zooxanthellae together with Siam City Cement (Lanka) Ltd in line with the Sustainable Goal #14. With the technical knowledge and guidance of Prof. Nalin Rathnayake of the Earth Resources Engineering Department of University of Moratuwa as well as Mr. Thomas Lee Berry a professional Maldivian diver and an expert in the field of coral reefs. We have designed necessary structures which are under construction by





Siam City Cement. These structures will be deployed at a location in the coastal line of Unawatuna. A workshop is to be conducted in the hope of raising awareness of the society with regard of the values in protecting these resources. The location was designated after considering the final results of a survey carried out at 3 locations in the coastal line of Unawatuna.

In parallel to the goals set by the UN we have set a vision to not only provide a base for the regeneration of corals but also to monitor the development of the process. We understand that the deposition of these structures alone would not lead us to meet our vision. Therefore along with providing a substitution for the problem we also have to treat the root cause of this destruction. The main cause for the degradation of corals and marine life associated to it are the harmful human activities which consist of extracting these precious corals for different purposes such as production of lime, blast fishing and overuse of reef resources as well as harmful land use practices. We have planned a workshop to bring our vision of a safer and cleaner ocean for all marine species into action. By starting a discussion with the society about the impact of these resources to the environment as a whole and spread awareness among the youth.





Public Relations orts of the Club

Since the planning stage of the Rotaract year, public relationship was given of major importance. A PR team was set up for planning and coordinating public relationship aspect of the projects. A new set of PR guidelines were prepared and adopted throughout the year. Each committee appointed for organizing the projects comprised of photographers, designers, content writers and article writers whose efforts directly affected in communicating the idea of the project to the society.

A strong public relations plan is required for any project to increase participation of members, public, raise funds and increase awareness of the project. Social media networks such as facebook, youtube, flicker, twitter and emails were used to spread the word about the projects using event pages, promotional videos, promotional flyers, profile pictures, cover photos attractive emails and tweets. Facebook live videos were published covering many projects. Post PR of the projects were done through publishing the photo albums and blog articles. A special PR plan was carried out for birthday celebrations and congratulatory occasions of the members. Project chairpersons were appreciated using special set of flyers.

Comprising of more than 200 members, twitter became one of the most convenient way to communicate the details of the projects and meetings to the members. Various facebook and whatsapp threads were also used to share the internal messages within the club. Emails regarding the projects conducted by our club were shared via the fellow Rotaract clubs of District 3220. Official email group of Rotaract Mora was used to share the important messages and emails sent by District Council.

With the relaunching of the Rotaract Mora blog, we could receive much more public attraction through its novel appearance and posts. At the same time a skillful set of writers were gathered around the blog. The websites of the club were continuously updated.

Relationship with the District officials and fellow Rotaract clubs aided highly in the successful completion of the projects. Our members participated in all of the District projects and in majority of the projects organized by fellow Rotaract clubs. The participation of the members of Rotaract clubs of District 3220 in majority of our projects could be identified as a significant advancement achieved through the PR effort.

Banners and stalls were put up during the Colombo International Book Fair in aid of the projects like 'Grama Prabodhaya' and 'Hand in Hand'. A special poster campaign was carried out and regional paper articles were published targeting 'Healing Hands', the health camp conducted as a sub project of 'Grama Prabodhaya'. 'Are You Ready? 2016' was covered via Derana TV. At the end of the year, a sticker campaign was carried out for raising public awareness on eradicating women abuse, with related to the International Service project 'One Global Force'.

Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa received a wide publicity within the university as well as the country with the recognition received by Rotary International for the project 'Grama Prabodhaya'. A set of newspaper articles were published and a news bulletin was presented in 'Ada Derana News'. Hoardings and banners were always used in order to increase awareness of the projects within the university. Promotional T-shirts were printed for events like 'Are You Ready?' and 'E-Sports'. Specifically a club T-shirt was printed with the new club logo and the year theme colours.

The relationship with international community was also went a step further through the 'Sojourn Phase2' India visit. Strengthening the ties with our twin club, Rotaract Club of Bombay Film City a joint bulletin 'Reconteur' was published in parallel to the project.

Public Relations of the projects of Rotaract Mora as well as other Rotaract clubs would reach greater heights with the introduction of LinkR, the web based platform specially designed for Rotaractors, while enabling them to take part in projects organized by local and global Rotaract clubs.
